Teaching needs include child/family systems, social psychology, lifespan development, health psychology, forensics, multicultural competency, research methods and data analysis (quantitative and qualitative), and assessment (e.g. personality, cognitive, neuropsychological).

Position Responsibilities

Annual responsibilities for this part-time position include teaching four core classes, attend a two-day annual Psy.D. Program Review meeting in September, and any combination of the following duties: (a) advise up to 5 students, (b) clinical supervision of up to 3 students, 3 quarters per year, (c) chair dissertation up to 2 students, and/or (d) other duties as assigned by the Program Chair and/or Dean.
